I want to thank you all for your support in keeping our residents and staff safe from the COVID-19 Virus. In particular, your flexibility and graciousness in accepting the limitations that the Government has placed on us in limiting visits for residents during lockdown periods. We have had to adapt many of our previously regular lifestyle programs to meet the requirements which has limited the engagement of our many Volunteers. Our Lifestyle Coordinator is revising programs so that we can begin slowly reintroducing volunteers back into the life of Prom Country House - they have been very much missed!

At this time, we are awaiting notification from the Gippsland Public Health Unit about a date for the rollout of the COVID-19 Vaccine that commenced in other parts of Gippsland this week. We are talking with staff and residents about the Vaccine and have provided information to families via our regular emails about the consent requirements and other facts about the Vaccine itself. Please take some time to read about the Vaccines available and don't hesitate to speak with your health professional about the benefits of the Vaccine and any questions you may have.

The Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety is on track to deliver a historic set of recommendations to overhaul the aged care system on February 26, 2021. Dignity of risk and choices:

The importance of residents being able to make decisions and to take part in risk taking activities, is mentioned in the Aged Care Standards. The risk taking activities could be the use of cot sides to prevent falls, the use of a bed pole and the choice of not eating a soft diet even though a speech pathology assessment has determined this diet. To ensure our residents wishes are heard and acted on a Risk Taking Consent form will need to be completed prior to any changes. The care plan will reflect this, and any foreseen risks will be discussed.

FROM THE ACTIVITIES CORNER

THINGS TO PONDER

With the possibility of an election later this year, you may want to take the opportunity to talk with your loved one about voting. Persons in the early stages of dementia, who are still capable of understanding the nature and significance of enrolment and voting, may be able to continue to enrol and vote. If you are unsure, please consult with your doctor.

Where someone may require additional support to enrol and vote, the AEC provides a range of information written in easy English.

Persons of unsound mind and who are incapable of understanding the nature and significance of voting are not entitled to enrol or vote. If your loved one is one of these persons, then you will be required to complete a form to remove their name from the electoral role. This will ensure elimination of undue political influence exerted on them and to help them avoid a penalty for failing to vote. The medical certificate on the form MUST be completed and signed by a registered MEDICAL PRACTITIONER.

- Once the form is completed, please return it to the AEC. Forms can be downloaded from the AEC website (Objection claim that an elector should not be enrolled) or from the main reception during normal business hours.
- Does your loved one have or are you thinking of getting them a mobile scooter? If yes, then please do not forget the insurance. Resident scooters are not covered under the PCAC policies. Though it is not necessary to have mobile scooter insurance, it is highly recommended.
